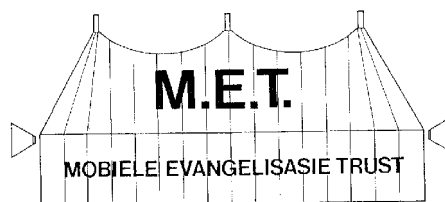

	<p>1. THE ANT AND THE FLY</p> <p>The Bible teaches: "Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise". (Prov 6.6)</p> <p>There are two kinds of people in the world. Some people are like flies and others like ants. A fly tends to overindulge, vomit and then start all over again. He does not consider the future and never makes provision for tomorrow. But ants are different. They are hardworking and always busy in order to provide for the future. Some people are like flies and others like ants. Fly-people are only living for the moment and never consider the final outcome of their lives. They live for the pleasure of the moment. Ant-people also think of the future. They ponder on the final outcome of life and the coming judgement. You are like a fly if you do not consider your destination in life.</p> <p>What is going to happen when you die?</p>

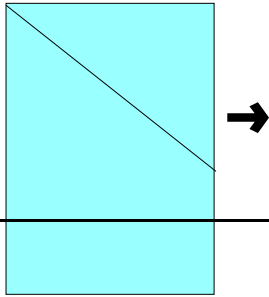


FOLDING

When entering heaven, the man was asked by an angel:

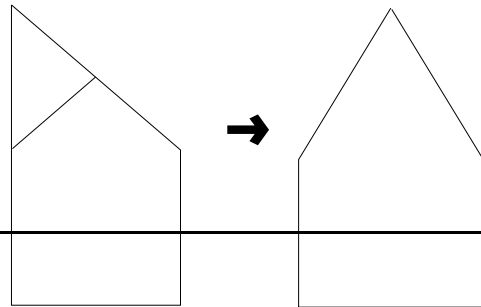
"Why should you be allowed in heaven?"

Man: *"I have attended church!"*



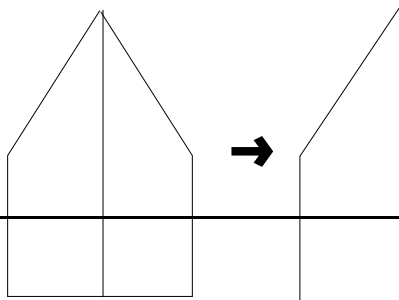
Angel: *"I am sorry, but that's not sufficient!"*

Angel: *"I am sorry, that is not sufficient!"*

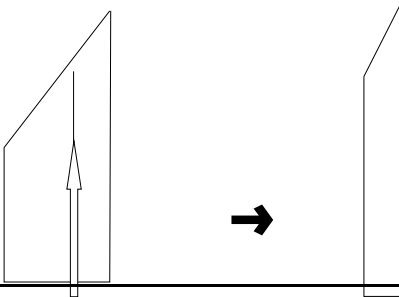
Man: *"As a matter of fact, my life was always as straight as an arrow!"*



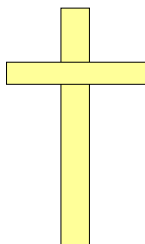
Satan takes the card and tears it down the middle, from the one side to the other, saying:

The angle takes the two pieces, throws the one piece away and folds open the other piece.

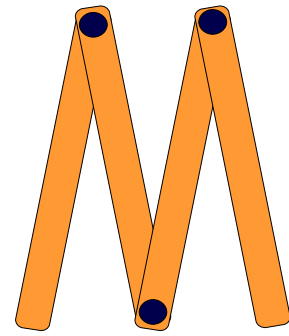

C. FOUR CARD-BOARD PIECES

By using four pieces of cardboard you can make yourself an handy instrument for bringing the message of:

Matt 9:1-8; Mark 2:1-12; Luk 5:17-26



Matt 9:1-8

a) 1 Jesus stepped into a **(a) boat**, **(b) crossed over** and came to his own town.

Mark 2:1-12

b) 1 A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home.

c) 2 So many gathered that there **(c) was no room left**, not even outside the **(d) door**, and he preached the word to them.

d) 3 Some men came, bringing to him a **(e) paralytic**, carried by **(f) four** of them.

e) 4 Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an **(g) opening in the roof** above Jesus and, after digging through it, **(h) lowered** the **(i) mat** on which the paralysed man was lying.

f) 5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven."

g) 6 Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves,

7 "Why does this fellow talk like that? He's blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"

h) 8 Immediately Jesus knew in his spirit that this was what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things?"

i) 9 Which is easier: to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your mat and walk'?

j) 10 But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins..." He said to the paralytic,

11 "I tell you, **(j) get up**, take your mat and go home."

k) 12 He got up, **(k) took his mat** and **(l) walked out** in full view of them all. This amazed everyone and they praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"
